- is able to use computers to improve efficiency and customer service in a hair salon
- has knowledge of the history of fashion and hairstyles and can adapt hairstyles to different periods in time
- has a knowledge of running a small business and its conditions in society
- is able to estimate time, material and other costs for a product or service
- is able to deliver a service/product that meets the customer's demand for function, design and quality
- is able to market, display and sell products as well as have a service-oriented approach
- is able to work in project forms, as well as with other occupational groups and in other areas
- is able to work in an ergonomically healthy manner with due regard for environmental factors, and also has knowledge of how the physical and mental working environment influences both the individual and employer/company

In addition, the holder of this document has knowledge at the upper secondary school level in Swedish, English, mathematics, arts, sports and health, science studies, religious studies and also civics.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

A hairstylist who has completed an upper secondary programme has the requisite knowledge for working in a hair salon and can provide services typically expected of a hair stylist, as detailed in section 3 above.
